He was known for throwing on a Tommy Bahama shirt for just about any occasion, his fondness of the mountains and the beach, and his love of flamingos. However, of all the things he enjoyed in life, he genuinely loved nothing more than just spending quality time with his wife and son.

He was the epitome of a good father, a loving husband and family man, and a great friend to anyone that had the pleasure of meeting him. You'll always be missed and forever loved.
